### Lab 5 – SVN II

#### Non-graded portions

Purposely create an svn conflict, using the [your name].txt file from last lab:

- Add a few lines to the file, but do not commit your changes yet.
- Have someone else in your group add a few lines (different from yours) to your file and commit their changes.
- Now try to commit your changes. Note what happens.
- Update your local copy. A conflict is born.

#### Graded Exercise – On your own

- Submit your file as is --with conflict markers (e.g. <<<<<<<, =====, >>>>>>>)-- to Sakai.
- Resolve the conflict how you see fit, and finally commit your changes back to the repo.

#### Recommended:

**After everyone has submitted their lab assignment**, your group might want to clean up its repository (delete the name.txt files from the repository).

I also encourage you to create the directories **trunk**, **tags**, and **branches** in the root of your repository, in the manner explained during lab session. Use trunk for your main development, branches for experimentation, and tags for “releases” of your project.
